The First Lady of the Republic of Cyprus, Mrs. Andri Anastasiades, was born and raised in Limassol, the first of three children of Spyros and Ersi Moustakoudes. After completing her studies in Civil Engineering in Athens, she worked in the Civil Service for several years upon her return to Cyprus.

She is married to Mr. Nicos Anastasiades, the

President of the Republic of Cyprus, since 1971, they have two daughters, Elsa and Ino, and four grandchildren, Andis, Nicoletta, Giorgos and Nicos.


At her own initiative, the Independent Social Support Body was founded and established as an institution by a unanimous vote of approval by the

House of Representatives. The Body functions with complete transparency and its main objective is to financially support students who due to unforeseen circumstances the continuation of their academic studies has been affected.

THE HONORABLE HARRIET PAVLES GEORGE

The Honorable Harriet George was born in Queens County. Parents were Philip H. Pavles, a Greek from Cyprus and Nelia Sommese Pavles, an American of Italian descent.

Valedictorian at graduation from P.S. 156, Laurelton ,Queens, and then on to the High School of Music and Art, in Manhattan. She earned her BA Degree from Hofstra University, completing the Four Year course in two and a half years. She married Norman George in her sen-

ior year.

She later received a Doctor of Law degree from Fordham University Law School where she was on the Dean's List. She gave birth to her first child three months before graduation. After passing the Bar Exam, she went into private practice for the next 20 years becoming President of the Queens County Women's Bar Association and into politics as a Republican Dis-

trict Leader and State committee-woman; first President and founder of the Queens County Women's Republican Club; counsel to State Senator Frank Padavan of the 11th Senatorial District of Queens.

She became a Judge of the Housing Part of the Civil Court of the City of New York for the next 20 years. Served as President of the Housing Judges Association and has been active in other Bar Associations including the Queens County Bar Association, the Hellenic American Lawyers Association and the Columbian Lawyers Association (Italian American Bar Association).

Active in religious, civic and philanthropic organizations:

Past Board member of the National Board of the Philoptochos Society, St. Michael's Home, Parish Council of Saint Demetrios Church of Jamaica and the Church's "Mr. and Mrs Club". She served and dedicated her time as a Board Member of the Cyprus Children's Fund for many years.


Chairman of St. Demetrios Church, NY where

\$20,000 was raised after the 1974 Invasion of Cyprus, past President of the Hellenic Parents Association and Den Mother in the Church Scouting program, past president of the Niobe Chapter of the Daughters of Penelope, the Jamaica Estates Women's Club, the Jamaica Estates Auxiliary to Jamaica Hospital.

Presently, a Board Member of the Hellenic Women's Club of the North Shore and the Forest Hills Women's Club and an officer of

the Philoptochos Society of Saint Demetrios Church Jamaica, N.Y. Member of the Pancyprian Federation and member of the Pancyprian Choir.

Her husband Norman George became a Supreme Court Judge and served until his death. They had six children together, two of whom became lawyers continuing the family connection to the law for four generations. One of her daughters married a Greek Cypriot and lives permanently in Cyprus. The Honorable Harriet Pavles George has thirteen grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

Origins and Evolution

In the aftermath of the brutal Turkish invasion and occupation of Cyprus in the summer of 1974, Greeks around the world rallied to the aid of the Cypriot people. The Cyprus Children's Fund, Inc., was established then as a one-on-one sponsorship program. Its primary scope was to provide relief and aid to the thousands of refugee children and their families. Over the years, this program has evolved into one that seeks to assist refugee and non-refugee children alike.

These children are helpless human beings, unable to affect changes in their lives, living under circumstances beyond their control. The Department of Social Welfare in Cyprus refers these children to the Cyprus Children's Fund, through the Ministry of Labor and Social Insurance. Selection is made after compilation of information and examination of each case; determination of the status is based on strict criteria of need. Many children need emotional support through foster parent contact, as well as financial support, which they receive through the Cyprus Children's Fund sponsorship of \$20 per month (minimum).

Currently, 40% of the children receiving aid, originate from displaced families. They represent problems of abandonment, single parenthood, substance abuse, neglect and other ills. Other cases include children of parents who battle mental illness and enclaved children (living in the Turkish occupied parts of Cyprus).

Societal Offerings to These Children

The cost of the Cyprus Children's Fund sponsorship is only 66 cents a day, \$20 per month. Your donation reaches a child in its totality. For this small amount you can make a difference to a youngster's life – share your kindness with one of the many children who need the caring of a stranger to help them in their lives. You provide support and security to orphaned, abandoned, underprivileged and enclaved children who continue to live in the Turkish occupied village of Rizokarpaso. For many families, the disintegration of life continues. Many are still caught in the grip of helplessness and dysfunction. A donation is a practical way to provide financial and moral assistance.

CCF Scholarships

Cyprus Children's Fund, Inc grants scholarships to students of Greek and Cypriot descent that study full time in American Universities and cannot afford tuition on their own. The selection of the awards takes place in New York each year, after the applications have been completed (Deadline April 30). The Fund awards an approximate amount of \$65,000 per year.

Getting to The Boathouse.

Central Park is closed to traffic. Whether by car or by foot, to reach The Boathouse, you enter the Park at Fifth Avenue and 72nd Street and follow the traffic road to the right. It is a very pleasant walk and should take between three and six minutes.

Small parking garages may be found as close as 72nd and 73rd off of Fifth Avenue but we suggest using the Metropolitan Museum's garage at 80th Street and Fifth Avenue. It is large enough so that you will always find a space and it is open 24 hours.

Our shuttle service will be available at approximately fifteen minute intervals to take guests to and from Fifth Avenue and The Boathouse. It will stop at the corner of 72nd Street and at 80th Street near the Metropolitan Museum's garage.
